New water rates went into effect on Jan. 1

You will see a \$2.86 average monthly increase on your utility bill if you live within the City of Tacoma and \$3.46 in our surrounding service area. As a public utility, we set rates to cover the costs of essential services. By gradually increasing rates over time, we can prevent large increases while still providing the services you rely on.

Your water rates cover the cost of providing clean, reliable water. This includes maintaining our water system, protecting natural resources near our facilities, complying with regulations, and investing in upgrades that improve your services. Increased costs to operate and care for our system, inflation in materials and supplies, supply chain shortages, and ongoing impacts from the unprecedented loss of our largest customer in 2024 are the primary factors affecting our rates for 2025 and 2026.

3 phases of power outage prep to know

Put a power outage plan together so you know what to do before, during, and after a storm.

Our outage map is the best way to track current outages at MyTPU.org/Outages.

- Register for the Tacoma Power outage platform to report outages and stay informed via text and email.
- Prepare an emergency kit, including batteries, flashlights, non-perishable food, and water.
- Have a list of contacts available and keep your cell phone(s) charged.
- View outage information and report outages in your area at MyTPU.org/Outages.
- Turn off and unplug electronics such as computers, TVs, and security systems.
- Turn off all appliances, water heater, air conditioning and heating units, and lights.
- Keep your refrigerator closed to keep food cold.
- Turn lights and appliances back on one at a time to avoid overloading circuit breakers.
- If you see downed power lines, do not go near them. Call 911. U*

Turn off the your teeth and washing your hands.



Repair dripping tap when brushing faucets and replace old toilet flappers to stop leaks.

How to protect your pipes from winter weather

When the water in your pipes freezes, it may cause them to burst. This can lead to property damage and leave you without running water. You can take steps now to protect them.

- · Insulate pipes: Insulating pipes help keep water from freezing and protects them from cracking.
- · Turn off the water: Turn off the water to outdoor spigots and drain any remaining water.
- Disconnect garden hoses: Disconnect, drain, and store garden hoses.
- · Locate your shutoff valve: Find the shutoff valve for emergencies, usually inside your home.
- Monitor your Usage Dashboard in MyAccount: During freezing weather, you may have a burst pipe or a leak if your usage graph doesn't drop to zero over 24 hours.

Knowing how many birthdays your water heater has celebrated
