

RESOLUTION NO. U-11503

A RESOLUTION relating to the Department of Public Utilities, Light Division; authorizing the extension of a special project of limited duration for the Network Communications Systems group within Utility Technology Services, for technology upgrades and designating general salary classifications and benefits for the person employed on the project, pursuant to Tacoma Municipal Code Sections 1.12.140, 1.12.155, 1.24.187, 1.24.980-986, and 1.30.300, and Section 6.1(h) of the Tacoma City Charter.

WHEREAS the City of Tacoma, Department of Public Utilities, Light

Division ("Tacoma Power"), Network Communications Systems group within

Utility Technology Services ("UTS") requests Public Utility Board approval for an extension of a special project of limited duration involving support of technology upgrades (the "Project"), and

WHEREAS Tacoma Power has been using Synchronous Optical

Networking ("SONET") communications technology for data communications for over 25 years and SONET has reached the end of its lifecycle, and

WHEREAS the Project involves replacing the aging SONET communications technology with Multi-Protocol Label Switching ("MPLS") technology, and

WHEREAS MPLS technology has been fully deployed in all of Tacoma

Power's substations, and services have been configured to complete the

current capital-related activities of the project, and

WHEREAS due to several unforeseen staffing events leading to extended resource absences, the final operational close-out activities need to be extended through July 2025, and



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WHERES the final stage of the project schedule has been impacted due to the resources' unexpected leave of absence, and

WHEREAS the City Charter will allow project employees in Tacoma Power, Tacoma Water and Customer Services across all phases of a project by extending a current project position approved by the Utility Bboard on March 22, 2023, under Resolution No. U-11374, and

WHEREAS the roles and services provided are described:

 Communication Systems Technician II: performs skilled and technical duties in the installation, repair, maintenance, and operation of a wide variety of equipment and devices related to communication systems; operates a variety of specialized tools and test equipment. The planned work for the remaining project scope is:

Work activities:

- Final site survey; photos and final field drawing markups
- Removal and surplus of antiquated nonfunctional equipment
- Completion of final compliance testing of critical services
- Site cleanup, removal of excess communication and power cabling, and
- Other operational activities as identified, and

WHEREAS this resolution will allow the project team to complete the remaining work in a controlled and systematic manner, and

WHEREAS the project is within its capital budget and the final project O&M close-out is expected to be completed by the end of July 2025, and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the provisions of Sections 1.12.155 and 1.24.187 of the Tacoma Municipal Code and Section 6.1(h) of the Tacoma City Charter, employees who are not regular employees and are hired as special



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project employees are paid as provided for by ordinance or resolution of the City Council, and

WHEREAS it is in the best interests of the Department of Public Utilities to establish and maintain a Special Project of Limited Duration and to hire a full-time temporary position to support the required activities for the duration of the Project; Now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE PUBLIC UTILITY BOARD OF THE CITY OF TACOMA:

Section 1. That the Project for Tacoma Power, Network

Communications Systems group within Utility Technology Services, for support
of technology upgrades, continue to be designated as a special project of
limited duration, and is hereby approved and established as a special project of
limited duration.

Section 2. That in accordance with the applicable provisions of TMC 1.12.140 and 1.12.155, the salaries and classes set forth in the Compensation Plan for regular City employees shall be applied, contingent upon funding, to similar project positions of the Project.

Section 3. That in accordance with TMC 1.24.187 and 1.30.300, employees who have been hired or may be hired for positions expected to be of limited duration shall be designated unclassified special project employees as of the date of hire.

Section 4. That the special project employee who has been hired or may be hired to work on the special project as identified in this resolution, shall receive benefits, all in accordance with and pursuant to the provisions of the



compensation plan of the City of Tacoma. The employee shall be given a one-time binding and irrevocable election to participate in the City's Retirement System, pursuant to the retirement provisions of TMC 1.30.300.

Section 5. That because the position to be filled pursuant to this resolution is of a temporary nature and is unique in that it pertains only to the aforementioned special project, it is deemed a temporary position, and the person so employed in such position shall have no claim to further or continued employment with the City after cessation of such special project or after cessation of activities funded by said programs, except pursuant to their obtaining status as a regular City employee under the provisions of the Tacoma Municipal Code or pursuant to further action of the City Council relating to this special project.

Section 6. That all acts by agents or employees of the City consistent with the intent of this resolution taken prior to the effective date of this resolution are hereby ratified.

Section 7. That the term of this special project shall not exceed the expiration of July 2025, unless extended by appropriate action.

Section 8. That the Director of Utilities is hereby authorized to direct the appropriate City officers to proceed with the necessary actions for project completion including the hiring of a special project position to support the required activities for the duration of the Project.



Briefly, the roles and services provided are described:

• Communication Systems Technician II: performs skilled and technical duties in the installation, repair, maintenance, and operation of a wide variety of equipment and devices related to communication systems; operates a variety of specialized tools and test equipment. The planned work for the remaining project scope is:

- Final site survey; photos and final field drawing markups
- Removal and surplus of antiquated nonfunctional equipment
- Completion of final compliance testing of critical services
- · Site cleanup, removal of excess communication and power cabling
- Other operational activities as identified.

BACKGROUND: The Network Communication Systems group in Tacoma Power's Utility Technology Services division has replaced its' aging Synchronous Optical Networking (SONET) communications technology with Multi-Protocol Label Switching (MPLS) technology. Tacoma Power has been using SONET for data communications for over 25 years. TPU's MPLS technology has been fully deployed in all of Tacoma Power's substations, and services have been configured to complete the current capital-related activities of the project. Due to several unforeseen staffing events leading to extended resource absences, the final operational close-out activities need to be extended through July 2025.

The final stage of the project schedule has been impacted due to the resources' unexpected leave of absence. A RESOLUTION authorizing the establishment of a special project of limited duration for Tacoma Power, Network Communications Systems group within Utility Technology Services, for technology upgrades and designating general salary classifications and benefits for the person employed on the project, pursuant to Tacoma Municipal Code Sections 1.12.140, 1.12.155, 1.24.187, 1.24.980-986, and 1.30.300, and Section 6.1(h) of the Tacoma City Charter.

WHEREAS the City of Tacoma, Department of Public Utilities, Light

Division (d.b.a. "Tacoma Power"), Network Communications Systems group

within Utility Technology Services ("UTS") requests Public Utility Board approval
for a special project of limited duration involving support of technology upgrades

("Project"), and

WHEREAS the Project will support the replacement of the aging Synchronous Optical Networking ("SONET") communications technology with Multi-Protocol Label Switching ("MLPS") technology, and

WHEREAS Tacoma Power has been using SONET for data communications for over 25 years and it has reached the end of its lifecycle, and

WHEREAS MPLS technology was deployed in phase 1 of the Wide Area

Network upgrade during the last biennium, and

WHEREAS the current capital project is expected to run through the end of 2024, and includes deploying and transitioning network data services at each of the 70 Tacoma Power Distribution Substations on five communication network rings, and



WHEREAS the project schedule has been impacted due to resource attrition and an expected leave of absence, and therefore, with Board approval, this resolution will enable UTS to hire a special project Communication Systems Technician II, ensuring the project team has sufficient resources to complete the remaining work on schedule within the budget included for the project in the Capital budget for 2023/2024, and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the provisions of Sections 1.12.155 and 1.24.187 of the Tacoma Municipal Code and Section 6.1(h) of the Tacoma City Charter, employees who are not regular employees and are hired as special project employees are paid as provided for by ordinance or resolution of the City Council, and

WHEREAS it is in the best interests of the Department of Public Utilities to establish a Special Project of Limited Duration and to hire a full-time temporary position to support the required activities for the duration of the Project; Now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE PUBLIC UTILITY BOARD OF THE CITY OF TACOMA:

Section 1. That the Project for Tacoma Power, Network

Communications Systems group within Utility Technology Services, for support
of technology upgrades, be designated as a special project of limited duration,
and is hereby approved and established as a special project of limited duration.

Section 2. That in accordance with the applicable provisions of TMC 1.12.140 and 1.12.155, the salaries and classes set forth in the

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Compensation Plan for regular City employees shall be applied, contingent upon funding, to similar project positions of the Project.

Section 3. That in accordance with TMC 1.24.187 and 1.30.300, employees who have been hired or may be hired for positions expected to be of limited duration shall be designated unclassified special project employees as of the date of hire.

Section 4. That the special project employee who has been hired or may be hired to work on the special project as identified in this resolution, shall receive benefits, all in accordance with and pursuant to the provisions of the compensation plan of the City of Tacoma. The employee shall be given a one-time binding and irrevocable election to participate in the City's Retirement System, pursuant to the retirement provisions of TMC 1.30.300.

Section 5. That because the position to be filled pursuant to this resolution is of a temporary nature and is unique in that it pertains only to the aforementioned special project, it is deemed a temporary position, and the person so employed in such position shall have no claim to further or continued employment with the City after cessation of such special project or after cessation of activities funded by said programs, except pursuant to their obtaining status as a regular City employee under the provisions of the Tacoma Municipal Code or pursuant to further action of the City Council relating to this special project.



Section 6. That all acts by agents or employees of the City consistent with the intent of this resolution taken prior to the effective date of this resolution are hereby ratified.

SUMMARY: The Utility Technology Services of Tacoma Power recommends that the Public Utility Board approve the special project request pursuant to Tacoma Municipal Code Sections 1.12.140, 1.12.155, 1.24.187, 1.24.980-986, 1.30.300, and Section 6.1 (h) of the Tacoma City Charter which will allow project employees in Tacoma Power, Tacoma Water and Customer Services across all phases of the project. Briefly, the roles and services provided are described:

Communication Systems Technician II: performs skilled and technical duties in the installation, repair. maintenance, and operation of a wide variety of equipment and devices related to communication systems; operate a variety of specialized tools and test equipment. Planned work for the remaining 35+ sites is estimated around 2000 hours.

Work activities:

- Preliminary site survey; photos, drawings, and notes of current state
- Identify site activities; HFC, power upgrades needed, rack moves
- Pre-stage equipment in lab, preliminary configuration assistance and testing
- Site installation, configuration assistance and commissioning
- Final site survey to include photos, drawings, and notes
- Work with Engineering Tech to update as-built drawings
- Support critical services cutover activities on 70 sites
- Assist with decommissioning
- Other capital activities as identified

BACKGROUND: The Network Communication Systems group, in Tacoma Power's Utility Technology Services division is currently replacing the aging Synchronous Optical Networking (SONET) communications technology with Multi-Protocol Label Switching (MPLS) technology. Tacoma Power has been using SONET for data communications for over 25 years and it has, unfortunately, reached its end of

lifecycle. MPLS technology was deployed in phase 1 of the Wide Area Network upgrade during the last biennium. The current capital project is expected to run through the end of 2024 and includes deploying and transitioning network data services at each of the 70 Tacoma Power Distribution Substations on five communication network rings.

The project schedule has been impacted due to resource attrition and an expected leave of absence. This resolution will give UTS the authority to hire a project Communication Systems Technician II thereby ensuring the project team has sufficient resources to complete the remaining work on schedule and within project budget. Final project close out is expected to complete in December 2024.

Funding has been included in the projects Capital budget for 2023/2024.
